16th ASIAN Games Guangzhou 2010 Sailing Competition

12th-27th November 2010, Shanwei, China

The 16th Asian Games Sailing Competition will be held at the Guangdong Ocean Sports Training Centre (GOSTC), Shanwei, China. The organizing authority is the Asian Sailing Federation (ASAF) and the Guangzhou Asian Games Organizing Committee(GAGOC)

NOTICE of RACE (12072010)

1. RULES

- 1.1. The 16th Asian Games Sailing Competition will be governed by the Rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. No national prescription will apply.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.4 The Equipment Rules of Sailing and current class rules of competing classes will apply except that class rules on class association membership and championships rules will not apply.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- 2.2. While afloat, athletes shall wear bibs, supplied by the organizing authority, displaying their national letters on the outside of all other clothing and equipment.

3. ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1.ISAF Eligibility shall apply. Each athlete shall be registered as an ISAF Sailor on the ISAF website: www.sailing.org/isafsailor
- 3.2 The following events and classes will compete in the competition:

Class Rule 3.1	

- 3.3. The Members National Authorities (MNA) to which all competitors belong must be fully paid up members of International Sailing Federation (ISAF) & of Asian Sailing Federation (ASAF).
- 3.4. Competitors for Optimist Class must be born in 1995 or after.
- 3.5. Competitors for 420 Class must be born in 1991 or after.
- 3.6. Proof of age shall produced at registration.
- 3.7. Each class will be sailed with a minimum of 6 MNAs entered include a minimum of 4 MNAs registered on site. The organizing authority will cancel an event if the minimum number of entries have not been received by the final entry deadline, or, if the minimum number of entries have been received by the final entry deadline but the number of MNAs registered on site of the regatta venue is 4 or less.

4. ENTRY

- 4.1. Eligible boats may enter by completing the attached form and sending it by the date prescribed in this instruction.
- 4.2. For reason of planning (accommodation and boats availability for charter) the Preliminary Entry Form and the Charter Boat Request must be received by GAGOC no later than 30th Jul. 2009.
- 4.3. Final Entry Form shall be received by GAGOC no later than 20th Oct. 2010.
- 4.4. Entries are not accepted after 20th Oct. 2010.
- 4.5. An MNA may enter a maximum of one entry per event/class.

5. ON-SITE REGISTRATION

Athletes, coaches and team leaders shall complete an on-site registration form at the Sports Information Desk in the competition venue from 0900 to 1730 between 10 November to 12 November 2010. Teams may send a team manager with all necessary documents to complete the registration. Athletes not registered within this period will not be allowed to participate in the sailing competition.

6. SCHEDULE

- 6.2. Twelve races are scheduled for each event/class except for the J80 Match Racing.
- 6.3. Two races per day are scheduled for each event/class, except for the J80 Match Racing, but one additional race per day may be sailed for scheduling reasons.
- 6.4. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1200.
- 6.5. No Warning Signal will be made after 1400 hours on 21st November 2010.
- 6.6. From 13 to 21 Nov., a team leaders' meeting will be held at 0900 in the Briefing Room at the Administration Center.
- 6.7 Schedule and format for the Match Racing event will be issued with the Sailing Instructions. The first meeting with the umpires for competitors in the Match Racing event is scheduled for 1000 on 15 Nov. in the Briefing Room at the Administration Center. The intention of the Race Committee is to run the Match Racing from 16th Nov. to 21st Nov. 2010.
- 6.8. Except for the J80 Match Racing, a minimum of 4 races will be sailed to constitute the championship. If six and more are sailed one discard will be allowed.

7. MEASUREMENT

- 7.1. Except for the Laser, Optimist and J80 classes, each boat where applicable shall produce a valid measurement certificate. Where applicable classes requiring a measurement certificate shall produce that certificate or a certified copy with its entry form. A certified copy may be be required at time of measurement for sighting by the Measurement Committee
- 7.2. Substitution of the damaged equipment may be permitted provided the damaged equipment has been checked by Measurement Committee and substituting equipment is presented to Measurement Committee. Such substitution will be subject to the approval of International Jury.

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be made available at the venue. The Sailing Instruction will be also issued to each team and competitor on completion of registration.

9. VENUE

- 9.1 Attachment A shows the venue and the location of the regatta harbour.
- 9.2 Racing Areas will be located on the Honghai Bay approximately 20 minutes sailing from the launching area. Attachment B shows the location of the racing areas. The racing area for match racing will be the area between the Area MR.
- 9.3 The Racing Areas assignments is as showing below.

10. COURSES

The courses will be Trapezoid or Windward/Leeward as described in the Sailing Instructions.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1. For the multihull class rules 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.
- 11.2. An International Jury will be appointed in accordance with RRS 91(b). Its decisions will be final as provided in rule 70.5.

12. SCORING

12.1 Fleet Racing

- 12.1.1 The Low Point System of RRS Appendix A will apply. RRS B8 is deleted.
- 12.1.2 Four races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.1.3. When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 12.1.4 When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

12.2 Match Racing

- 12.2.1 The scoring system of RRS Appendix C will apply.
- 12.2.2. Add RRS C10.3(b): 'When a single round robin is terminated before completion, or a multiple round robin is terminated during the first round robin, the highest score shall be determined as the average points scored per match sailed by each competitor, unless one or more competitor has completed less than one third of the scheduled matches when the entire round robin shall be disregarded and if necessary the event declared void.'

13. TEAM SUPPORT BOAT

- 13.1. Team Leaders, Coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start, until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 13.2. Support Boat shall be marked with their National Flags or National letters.

13.3. Limited support boat can be made available on charter provided advance request is received by the Organizing Committee at the preliminary registration.

14. BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places in the boat park or harbour.

15. DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS

Underwater breathing apparatus and plastic pools or their equivalent shall not be used around keelboats between the preparatory signal of the first race and the end of the regatta.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions, text messages or cellular phone calls not available to all boats while racing.

17. PRIZES

- 18.1. Medals will be awarded to top 3 positions in each event/class.
- 18.2. Certificate of participation will be given to each participant (sailors & officials).

18. SAFETY

- 18.1. All sailing boats except boards must have a towing rope on board 15 meters in length, or towing facility as per Class rules.
- 18.2.In addition to IODA Class Rules 4.2(a) and (b), 4.3(a) and (b) each Optimist boat shall have on board a secured paddle with a surface of not less than 0.25 square meters and each competitor shall carry a whistle attached to his/her clothing or body.
- 18.3. Competitors not complying with this instruction will get added to their score a penalty of 5 points for each race of the day on which they have failed to observe this instruction.
- 18.4. All competitors shall bring their own personal buoyancy which must be capable of being fastened at all time while afloat. Wet / dry suit do not constitute adequate personal buoyancy.

19. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

20. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of USD300,000 per event or the equivalent. A photocopy of the insurance certificate shall be submitted to the organizing authority at registration.

21. RIGHT TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

By participating in the 16th Asian Games Sailing Competition, an athlete automatically grants to the organizing authority and its sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of the athlete during the period of the competition without compensation.

22. CHARTER BOATS

- 22.1. Competitors may bring their own boats except Optimist, Laser and J80. However limited number of boats are available for charter for Mistral and Hobbie-1 Classes. The countries who have responded to our request of indicating their charter requirement at the preliminary registration will be given preference.
- 22.2 Optimist competitors shall use only the Hulls provided by the Organizers, but may use their own foils, spars, fittings and running rigging. Competitors shall not modify the fixed fittings or permanently mark or puncture the hull in any way. Non permanent alterations such as tape and/or rope may be used in accordance with the class rules provided the boat can be returned to its original condition without permanent damage.
- 22.3. Competitors must bring their own sails, except for the J80 Match Racing.
- 22.4. The charter charges of the following classes for the entire duration will be as under:

23. IMMIGRATION POINT AND EQUIPMENT DECLARATION

- 23.1 The Organizing Committee suggests that participants enter China through the Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport, or the Guangzhou Tianhe East Railway Station, or the Shenzhen Airport and the Shenzhen Luohu customs.
- 23.2 Boats or other equipments must be declared at the Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport or the Guangzhou Tianhe East Railway Station.
- 23.3 For delegations who enter China via other ports in Guangzhou, your arrival or departure information need to be provided to GAGOC 24 hours in advance.
- 23.4 For delegations who enter China via Beijing, Urumchi, Shenzhen, Zhuhai, these

ports authorities will provide accredited participants Asian Games dedicated lanes, flight transit and information assistance. Delegations must make their own arrangement regarding the travel from those ports to Shanwei by themselves.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

(not part of the notice of race)

1. CONTAINERS AND EQUIPMENT

Please note that for security and operational reasons any container must enter the venue between 3 and 5 November 2010 and will remain in place until 22 November 2010.

Venue security will check all containers in the venue on 4 and 5 November 2010. Teams should send 1 or 2 delegates (with validated Asian Games Identity and Accreditation Cards) to the venue to help at the security check, or teams may authorize the shipping company to help with this.

All containers and equipment shall be removed from the venue by 18:00 on 24 November 2010.

Delegation may use its own international freight forwarder and ship equipments to the designated point of entry—Guangzhou Huangpu Port, Guangzhou Nansha Port before 1 November, 2010. GAGOC will provide assistances.

GAGOC will be responsible for shipping equipment from the designated point of entry to Shanwei Athletes' Sub-Village and send equipment to the point of entry after the Games.

All the equipment details in the container and relevant information must be provided to GAGOC before 15 October, 2010.

GAGOC will be responsible for the payment of delivering service from the designated point of entry to Shanwei Athletes' Sub-Village and will not be responsible for the payment of any international freight charg

Electricity supply will be available in the container area. Please be aware that power supply within the venue is 220 V with 20 A maximum for each team.

2. NO SMOKING

The competition venue is a no-smoking venue.

3. ACCOMMODATION AND CATERING

Accredited participants will accommodated in De Sheng Hotel in the Guangdong Ocean Sports Training Centre (GOSTC) according to the GAGOC accommodation policy.

The Dinning Hall of the GOSTC will provide athletes with breakfast, lunch and dinner. The opening hour of it is from 7am to 9pm for each village opening day. The ground floor is muslin and vegetarian cuisine and the first floor is Chinese and Western cuisine.

Each participant will be required to pay a village facilities item deposit fee of US \$50 per person.

The fee for accomodation is as follows:

Double room: 50 USD per person per day (Meals are included in the fee)

Single room: 80 USD per person per day (Meals are included in the fee)


